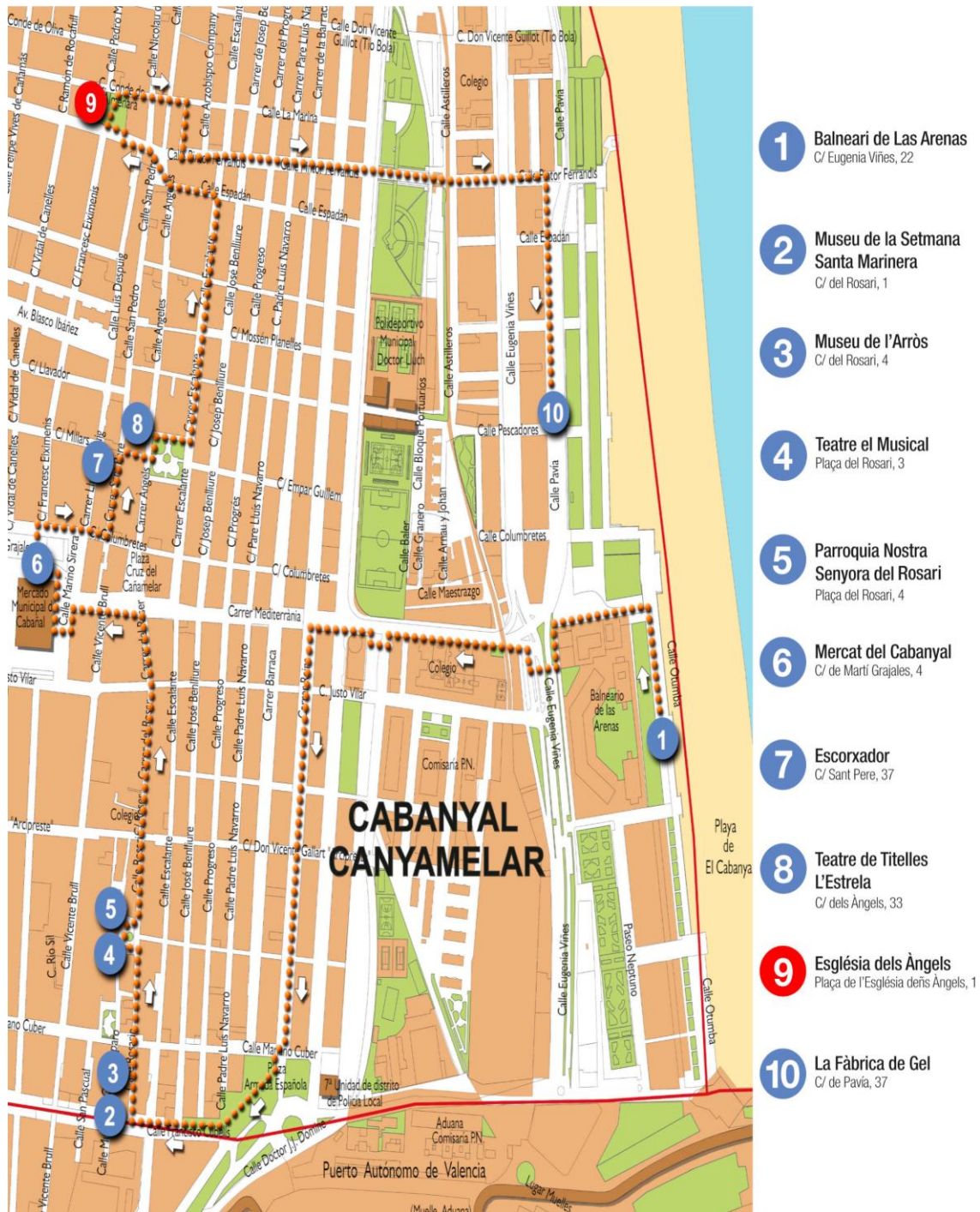


9. Nuestra Señora de los Ángeles Parish Church



HISTORY: It was founded as a hermitage of the fishermen's guild; it belonged to the church of Santo Tomás de Valencia. Its lowest tower served as a lighthouse to guide fishermen and sailors and its light could be seen from the vegetable garden. It suffered serious damage during the Civil War and the great flood of Valencia; it was therefore refurbished, above all in its interior. Its classic façade presents the images of St Andrew and St Peter, both of whom were fishermen. At the high altar is the Virgin of Our Lady of the Angels, to whom the church is dedicated. The church of los Ángeles hosts the Most Holy Christ the Saviour, patron saint of the Cabanyal and the Virgin of the Sorrows.



PHYSICAL DISABILITY

Access: Double-leaf entrance door, open permanently, with free passage more than 250 cm-wide, followed by step 15 cm spanned by mobile ramp 111 cm wide and 100 cm long and a 12.5% slope.

Second doors, located one on each side of the entrance, with 100 cm-wide free passage, open permanently.

Internal mobility: Aisles with free passage more than 150 cm-wide, with occasional narrow points at the sides of 80 cm. Central aisle with more than 200 cm-wide free passage. Pews with a height of 43 cm and 10 cm footrest.



VISUAL IMPAIRMENT

Access: Double-leaf entrance door opens permanently, followed by step 15 cm spanned by a mobile ramp 111 cm wide and 100 cm long and a 12.5% slope, with tactile-visual signage and non-slip paving. Second doors located each side of the entrance open permanently.

Internal mobility: Non-slip paving, homogeneous. Without cantilevered obstacles. Non-homogeneous lowintensity lighting.



HEARING IMPAIRMENT

Internal mobility: The Parish has speakers that amplify the sound.
