ALQUERIA DEL RELOJ

Señorial Alqueria, probably XVII century, emblematic presence of which highlight the large dimension's attic that, constructed on uneven gabled hight, used to save the crops and silkworm breeding.

It belonged to the marquess of Benimegis y Systalla during XVIII and XIX centuries, that afterward, Marquess de Torrecilla bought by the end XIX century, later on the Duke of Saint Mauro and, lately the Countess of San Martin de Hoyos. By the XVIII century underwent a major refurbish to adapt it to agricultural uses, with the opening of 15 windows of the attic and closing three large original windows.

It should be noted, also, the Main Door, The Ground Entrance for carriages and some interior elements, as the ogee arch that gave access to a small chapel.

The clock on the facade and another at a side gave the hours from sunrise to sunset. It is documented since 1788 as rented to Marco's family (El Pistons).
