
#### 2. Acequia de Vera



Acequia de Vera indicates the boundary between the Coastal Towns of Valencia and the town of Alboraya.

La Malvarrosa was a marshy land or a great "swamp" until the 18th century. Irrigation ditches and roads demarcate the physical division of the neighbourhoods of the Coastal Towns. La Malvarrosa's borders are between the Acequia de Vera and the Acequia de la Cadena, in Avenida de los Naranjos.

**Vera's parent canal is the Mestalla canal**. Over its course, Mestalla is subdivided into several arms, or secondary canals. First, the **Brazo de Rambla**, which in turn deviates through the **Brazo de Escamarda**, next to the Camino de Vera, and which at the Polytechnic University heads towards the sea.

La Acequia de la Cadena, which comes from the same Brazo de Rambla, is diverted into the Brazo del Arquet by the old San Juan de Dios asylum and the Funeral home. The Cadena tram stop and calle Sequia de la Cadena next to the Hospital de la Malvarrosa are named after it.

An acequia is a hydraulic works channel, or dam-weir in the riverbed, which carry the water to the irrigated land or store it.

The **streams** take the water to the **secondary canals**, which is administered in shifts.

The **overflows** prevent an excessive flow rate from destroying them: The **filters** retain any impurities.

Today, the large irrigated area has been reduced because of reforms to Valencia's urban planning.

**Under the city**, part of this great network of canals is still operational.

One space is reserved for people with reduced mobility at Calle Isabel de Villena, 177, with an area of more than 230 x 460cm. It has horizontal and vertical signage, it is located less than 10 m from the accessible route to the Acequia de Vera.

The mouth of the Acequia de Vera is located on a ramp with a width of more than 900 cm and more than 900 cm long, with a 5.6% incline.

The mouth of the Acequia de Vera is located on a free passage ramp with a width of more than 900 cm and more than 900 cm long, with a 5.6% incline. No tactile-visual signage at the start and end of the ramp.
