
3. Parish Church of María Inmaculada de Vera



The Parish Church of María Inmaculada de Vera was built after the Spanish Civil War between 1949 and 1953, upon becoming a parish independent of the Hermitage of Vera.

The architectural complex consists of the church and outbuildings, including the manse and an assembly hall. The façade is similar to the colonial type and the dome is influenced by the neighbouring hermitage of Vera.

Inside, the nave has six sections, a rectangular floor plan and a roof with wooden beams. The apse is in the shape of a Roman basilica. The mural paintings in the nave's arches are scenes from the life of Mary and Jesus, and the mural in the vault of the presbytery is a scene of the Virgin Mary stamping on the dragon of the Apocalypse.

The parish leaders have always been especially sensitive to the employment and social problems of the residents of La Malvarrosa. It was an educational centre in the 70s.

Current opening hours due to Covid-19: Saturdays from 18.30 to 20.00 Sundays from 11.30 to 13.00 Normal times of mass (during the year): Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday at 19.00 Sundays 09.30 at the hermitage and 12.00 at the Parish Church. Times of mass from July to September: Saturdays and eves of feast days at 19.00 Sundays at 09.00 at the Hermitage and at 11.00 at the Parish Church. (During summer, the daily mass is at 09.00 in Preciosísima Sangre).

It is located in a flat pedestrianised area, which is obstacle-free and has homogeneous paving.

Parking 🖶

Two public spaces are reserved for people with reduced mobility with an area of at least 200 x 500 cm and vertical and horizontal signage at **C/Mendizábal 14**, and at **C/Doctor Álvaro López, 64**, which is less than 300 m away. It has an accessible itinerary, with homogeneous paving as far as the Parish Church.

Access 👃

Access from the slopeless street, with a door that's over 200 cm wide and permanently open.

Access to the interior of the Parish Church through a door with free passage more than 200 cm wide. Behind the door, it has a staircase with a flight of 3 12 cm-high steps with a tread of 32 cm. No handrail.

There is an accessible itinerary via a ramp that is more than 145 cm long, more than 121 cm wide with a 22.2% slope. It has a single handrail at a height of 95 cm.

Indoor mobility 🖶

The Parish Church has one floor.

On each floor there is an itinerary without slopes with the exception of the access to the church, which has a single flight of stairs with 3 stairs, 12 cm high and with a tread of 32 cm. No handrail. It also has a ramp that is 145 cm long, more than 121 cm wide and which has a 22.2% slope. It has a single handrail at a height of 95 cm.

Corridors with free passage more than 150 cm wide with occasional narrowings of 80-130 cm.

A homogeneous floor, without slopes and with no overhanging obstacles.

44 cm-high seats with 13 cm-high footrests.

An approximately 80 cm space between seats.

The front area of the church has space for a wheelchair where a 150 cm-diameter circle can be described.

Access to the underlying Chapel is via a 12.1% incline ramp, which is 245 cm wide and 280 cm long. No handrail. Non-slip flooring.

The distance between pews forming the main aisle is more than 120 cm. There is furniture to rest inside the building.

Paving without projections and non-slip.

Access 🏠

Access from the slopeless street, with a door that's permanently open. Behind the door, there is a staircase with a flight of 3 12 cm-high steps with a 32 cm tread. No handrail. It has nosing but no skirting board on one side. It also has a ramp that is 145 cm long, more than 121 cm wide and which has a 22.2% slope. It has a single handrail at a height of 95 cm.

Indoor mobility 🐧

The Parish Church has one floor.

Throughout the building, there is an obstacle-free itinerary without unmarked overhanging elements.

On each floor there is an itinerary without slopes with the exception of the access to the church, which has a single flight of stairs with 3 stairs, 12 cm high and with a tread of 32 cm. No handrail. No protective skirting board on one side. No visual touch strips on each rung. It also has a ramp that is 145 cm long, more than 121 cm wide and which has a 22.2% slope. It has a single handrail at a height of 95 cm. Rimless, non-slip and homogeneous flooring.

Homogeneous low-intensity lighting.

Access to the underlying Chapel is via a 12.1% incline ramp, which is 245 cm wide and 280 cm long. No handrail. Non-slip flooring. No tactile-visual signage at the start and end of the ramp.

It has screens located throughout the Parish Church which show everything that happens inside.

The Parish Church has speakers that amplify the sound.
