
#### 4. Plaza de Félix Robillard



The Plaza de Félix Robillard was built among the former properties of the historic botanist. **Avenida de la Malvarrosa takes its name from his estate**.

Robillard was the **head gardener of the Champs Elysees** and was hired in 1848 as the **senior gardener at the Botanical Garden of Valencia**.

His fame derives from **his horticultural establishment**, his **publications**, his recognition in scientific societies, and for the great **improvements to the health of the land** in the modern-day neighbourhood **of la Malvarrosa**.

**He promoted the industrial-scale cultivation of geranium**, pelargonium capitatum, commonly known as **malvarrosa (hollyhock)**.

He was the founder of the first essences and toilet soaps factory in Spain.

The **export of his perfumes** promotes the name of Valencia throughout the entire world.

He has been buried at the Cabanyal Cemetery since 1888.

Located in a flat area, with cobbled paving and compacted earth. It has dropped kerbs in the crossing areas with tactile-visual signage.

It has a children's play area, a sports area with exercise equipment, a drinking fountain and an area for parking bicycles.

### Parking 📥

A space reserved for people with reduced mobility in Avenida Malvarrosa, 197 with an area of more than 200 x 460cm. It has horizontal and vertical signage, it is located less than 10 m from the accessible route to the plaza.

### Mobility 📥

Its pavements have free passage more than 150 cm wide.

It has urban furniture for resting distributed throughout the Plaza. There is an information panel at a height of 100-180 cm.

# Mobility ጰ

Paving on pavements with tactile-visual signage.

Pavements that are over 150 cm wide.

There may be unmarked overhanging elements on the itinerary.

It has a panel with information, written in medium-sized text and colour contrast.

## Mobility 🍠

There are information panels with pictograms or short texts indicating spaces and itineraries.
