

Nevertheless, its imprint still remains in the layout of many Street of the districts of Jesús, Patraix and la Olivereta, particularly in Tres Forques Street, one of the city's main streets.

The "Glass Palace" was a metal construction of french style, glazed on four sides and with a gable roof mounted on a masonry podium, to attend the level crossing in Turís Street.

It disappeared with the elimination of the railway line.

On the other side of the railway track was the neighbourhood of the Villas de Pontons: a group of humble buildings which were built in the area where the garden of the same name was.

It was an area inhabited by people who were not very well regarded by the neighbours of Patraix, which led to the appearance of popular saying that rhymed "Pontons" with unkind words.
