1. News from each organisation

- Maria told about a new EU project which they are going to participate in. There are 12 cities from all over Europe present in the project and the first meeting will be in October. The purpose is to exchange experiences between the countries.
- Katja told that a new manager has entered the Harz AG the previous week.
- Helle told that job rotation is top priority on the national political level, but so far nothing is settle concerning the economic aspects and the future framework

2. Presentation of the programme for this project meeting and study visit

- Helle gave an overview of the content of this visit, amongst others a presentation of the organizations that would be visited. And she described how the Jobcenter in Randers is organized.
- Helle drew up a model for job rotation where 120 employed nurses are getting 7 weeks of training, divided with 19 nurses on each course. To make this happened there are 19 unemployment nurses substituted for about 11 months. This project the participants would get to know better during this visit.

3. Presentation of the common guide by Maria

- An overview of the guide was presented by Maria. Due to the lack of time a further debate it was postponed until the 13th.

4. Dialogue with Mrs. Karina Rask, Jobcenter Randers

- The participants had a fruitful dialogue with Mrs. Rask about the labour market challenges, the means and methods to support unemployed people and different tools to qualify especially the low-skilled work force.

5. Visit to Gaia Museum for outsider art and the activities to support disabled people in development of their competences

- The participants went for a guided tour around the place by Mrs. Dorte Eiersbo, manager of the Museum and training activities. And there was a dialogue specifically about the tools to support disabled people and people with diagnosis in progression towards labour market

6. Visit to Youth Education Guidance Centre

- Mrs Anette Holm made a presentation about the Danish education system and the activities that the Centre is in charge of in terms of supporting young people up to the age of 25 years.

7. Visit to the training centre VIA University College

The participants were introduced to the educations that VIA is in charge of, that is nurses, pedagogical staff and psykomotorics by Mrs. Helle Brok. And they went for a guided tour around the training centre

8. Visit to the public library

Helle described how the library is a part of the common Culture House in Randers, and the participants went for a short visit.
