



## 16. Traditional home

Dating back to 1928, the property is built on a plot in the 5th island of the 1840 urban development plan on La Reina Street, with another façade on El Doctor Lluçh Street. The plot only has one home with two storeys.

The main facing is axially symmetrical with two openings on each level and a segmental arch lintel. A large wooden door with curved rails and a central post stands out on the ground floor, with one window on either side. Three balcony doors topped with elliptical oculi stand out on the upper floor.

The façade is modernist with baroque touches. Abundant curved lines give a feeling of movement and it is heavily decorated with prefabricated cement reliefs representing plants and geometric shapes; the sculptural value of the cornices and the upper part of the building stands out. The parapet with a stately frontispiece and an oval hole, frame the composition and give a slenderness to the façade.

Sunlight inside the home is controlled with traditional wooden blinds called *cadeneta* (chain blinds).

The rear façade is simpler and has one less storey.
