Hemingway visited València professionally several times to narrate the Civil War as he was a correspondent for several US media outlets, including the North American Newspaper Alliance (NANA). He did the same in 1937 when the city became capital of the Republic, documenting tensions and the effects the bombings had on the city.

In the documentary *The Spanish Earth*, for which he wrote and narrated part of the script, he told of his experience on the front and in cities such as València.

València port was a key place in both periods as it was consolidated as an important hub for trade and the economy.

During the Civil War, it played a strategic role to serve the Republic as a point for receiving supplies and international support. The conflict also caused damage to port facilities, affecting its operations and logistical capacity. It was rebuilt by the Franco regime after the war but the natural disaster of 1957, the great flooding, seriously damaged it again. Today, the port is one of the main economic and logistical driving forces in the Mediterranean.
