

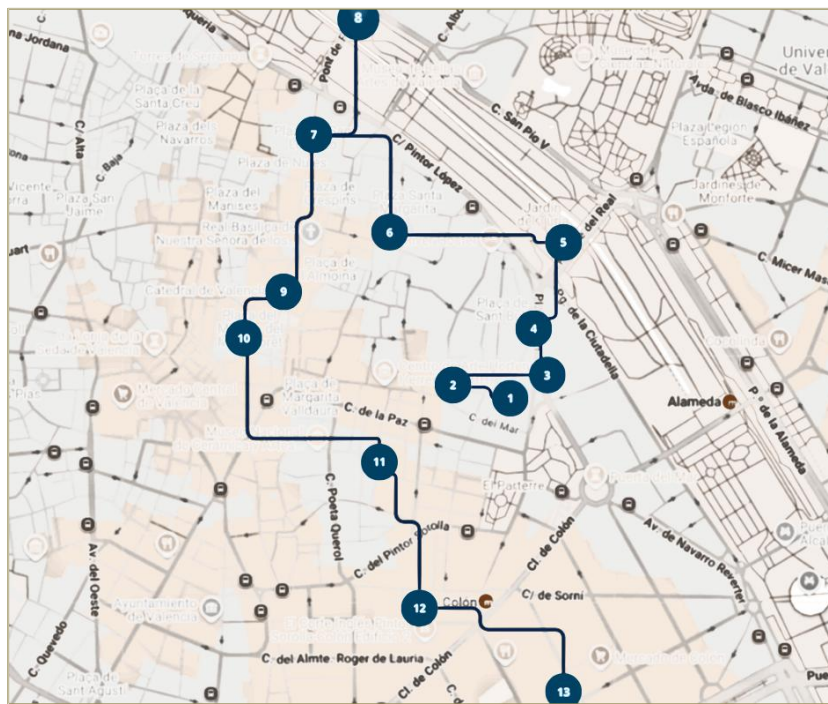
7. DORMITORIES (PALACE OF THE VALENCIAN PARLIAMENT)

A precursor to the Universitat de València, which would eventually be founded in 1499, are the Schools of Grammar and Arts that were installed in 1412 in the home that stood in this spot, currently the Palace of the Valencian Parliament or Benicarló Palace, thanks to the mediation and advice of Saint Vincent Ferrer.

The saint was key in founding the University of València as a driver of General Studies, which combined theology, art and science, making him the intellectual author of this initiative. So much so that the University of València organised a series of activities to mark the 600th anniversary of the Dominican's death. Proof of this is a medallion bearing the saint's image in the cloister of the former university building (La Nau Cultural Centre).

Also note that a painting that alludes to the saint creating General Studies can be observed in the La Nau Chapel of Wisdom, next to a future construction of the education centre that was created almost 100 years later, reaffirming Saint Vincent Ferrer's role in founding the University of València. Saint Vincent's name appears in the list of Valencian saints in the auditorium.
