



### 23. La Creu del Canyamellar Square

The trapezoidal La Creu del Canyamellar Square borders to the north with Les Columbretes Street, to the south with the En Gash irrigation channel (natural dividing line between El Cabanyal and El Canyamellar), with buildings originally erected with two or three storeys making up the remaining façades. During the development phase of the 1960-70s, high-rise buildings were constructed that changed the traditional aspect of the square. It can be found close to the former El Cabanyal market, today El Doctor Lorenzo de la Flor Square. According to the municipal map of 1929-1945, at that time its name was Galán Square.

A boundary cross stands in the square, replacing a former cross that indicated the old El Cabanyal or Algirós road. The current version from the 1960s was placed on one side of the square, close to today's Mediterráneo Avenue. It stands on an octagonal surface from which three ledges extend, of the same shape and decreasing size, forming the pedestal for the simple stone cross.

There was another cross in El Cabanyal, in Els Àngels Square opposite the church of the same name, which has now disappeared.
