



31. La Mare de Déu de Vallivana Square

La Mare de Déu de Vallivana Square can be found in El Cabanyal, bordering Cap de França, and demarcated by the old *Pixavaques* irrigation channel, today El Pintor Ferrandis Street. According to the municipal map of 1929-1945, at that time its name was Los Ángeles Square.

Trapezoidal in shape, Sant Pere Street, the limit of the traditional historic centre, and Espadà Street both converge in the square.

The geographic map of the València beach population of 1736 shows an urban space that corresponds to the square, surrounded by barracas and the irrigation channel.

Some traditional buildings facing onto the square remain, although most were replaced with high-rise buildings during the development phase.
