



34. Virgilio Cantó Winery

Erected in 1927, this building is popularly known as *La Fabriqueta*. Its founder, Virgilio Cantó, used the building to produce and sell spirits.

It can be found on the corner of El Pintor Ferrandis Street (old *Pixavaques* irrigation channel), El Progrés Street and El Pare Lluís Navarro Street.

Consisting of a ground floor and three upper levels, it is topped by a parapet on the roof terrace. A single-storey annex can be found at the back.

The main building has three entrances from El Pintor Ferrandis Street; the centre door leads to the three floors, framed with two viewpoints topped with cupolas over Solomonic columns, which enhance the rounded corners. The rest of the main façade is symmetrical to the door; on the ground floor, two secondary doors and windows, and the two upper floors with the same series of balcony doors where the only variant is a curved lintel on the second floor. This same scheme is repeated on the secondary façades.

They are profusely decorated with elements of baroque and classical influence; the building can be classified as an eclectic style with neo-baroque influence. The walls are exposed brick except for the wall sections on the first floor that are plastered and painted. A stone plinth runs along the base of the building. A cast iron railing along the continuous balconies of the two upper floors and the parapet stand out.
