



52. Traditional home

Built in 1918, the home is part of the neighbourhood's traditional architecture. It is a two-storey house.

The modernist façade is designed with a wooden doorway and window on the ground floor and two balcony doors on the top floor. Originally clad in continuous white tile (only preserved on the ground floor) with decorative coloured tiles on the cornice, parapet and ground floor medallions. Part of the frieze is covered in mosaic using the *trencadis* technique, representing floral motifs.

The railing consists of two horizontal wrought iron plates embedded in the wall, which support smooth bars with a central rosette decoration.
