Located opposite the Baroque door of the Palacio del Marqués de Dos Aguas, Hemingway also stayed at the Hotel Inglés during his time in València. It was inaugurated with that name in 1918, but it was in the 1930s when it became witness to important events as, among other factors, it was chosen to host the Government of the Republic, so many political decisions of the time were adopted or witnessed within its halls and rooms.

He stayed at this refurbished 18th century palace that belonged to the Dukes of Cardona with his first wife Hadley and, years later, during the Civil War, with journalist Marta Gelhorn, his then lover and, with time, his third wife. He chose the month of July with both women to coincide with bullfighting season.

Due to its central location, Hotel Inglés was a centre of cultural and, of course, social activity in the València of the Republic and later Franco. Images also show that it was an emblematic venue for high society events and meetings in València.

The hotel maintains its original façade after it was refurbished in 2017; work that focused on highlighting its British style.
