

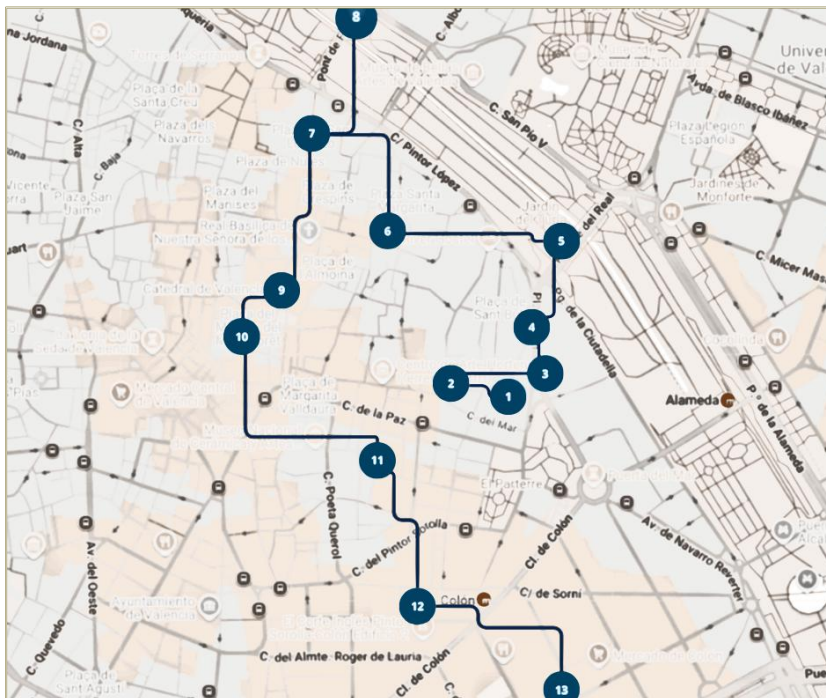
8. CERAMIC ALTARPIECE SANTA MÒNICA SQUARE

On the outer wall of the Church of Saint Monica, in the square of the same name, you can see a Valencian ceramic altarpiece that recalls one of the saint's solemn entrances into the city of València, when Franciscan brother Francesc Eiximenis asked him: "*Pare Vicent, ¿cómo va la vanidad?*" (Father Vincent, how is vanity going?); and he replied, "*Va y viene, pero no se detiene*" (It comes and goes, but never stops). This same inscription can be seen in the chapel to the left of the choir in the Church of Corpus Christi.

As a curiosity, we could say that this was one of the gates to the city from Puzol, Sagunto, Teruel and Barcelona.
